She becomes the focal point for Trujillos experimental ethnography of family relations, aging, and ethnic identity throughout the twentieth century. Collecting narratives of his grandmothers life, Trujillo learns how family members use stories to define the familys sense of itself and create collective views on intergenerational relations, social history, gender, class, and ethnicity. Through these stories, family photos, and his own recollections, supplemented with Elsies letters and journal entries, the author is able to explore topics often ignored in life histories of the elderlysexuality, body image, eating disorders, marital discord, mobility patterns, racial prejudice, and interactions with the health care system. Trujillos presentation brings Naunnys humor, liveliness, and generosity alive for scholars and students alike and provides a vivid portrait of being Hispanic and female in the 20th century American west.
